STAYING SAFE

Last year, a young child was seriously injured in the playground after being knocked to the ground while waiting with a parent after school. This accident was as a result of other children running around the busy playground after being dismissed by their teacher.

Please be responsible by ensuring that your child/children are well supervised. It is not safe for children to run around, or to ride bikes or scooters in the playground either before or after school. I am sure that you want to keep the children safe so please make sure that these simple rules are followed at all times.

Trips

We are proud to offer a wide range of fantastic learning experiences for our children, which includes educational day trips, residential visits and workshops. The children benefit greatly from being able to visit a range of museums, theatres and other establishments that fit with the curriculum topics and provide memorable learning experiences.



Rather than make charges for individual trips, this year we are asking parents for a one-off voluntary contribution of £15.00, which will cover all class day trips and workshops for the year. This payment is due on the first day of every academic year and is available on Parent Pay (thank you if you have already made payment).

Please note: This contribution does not include residential trips or the annual Broadstairs trip.

Rights Respecting Schools Award

The Unicef UK Rights Respecting Schools Award (RRSA) supports schools across the UK to embed human rights in their ethos and culture. The award recognises achievement in putting the UN Convention on the Right of the Child (UNCRC) at the heart of a school's practice to improve well-being and help all children realise their potential.

We are a Rights Respecting school and we are currently working towards achieving the Gold Award. This is the highest award granted by Unicef UK and there is a lot of work for us to do in order to achieve it.


