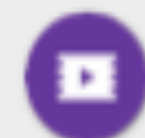

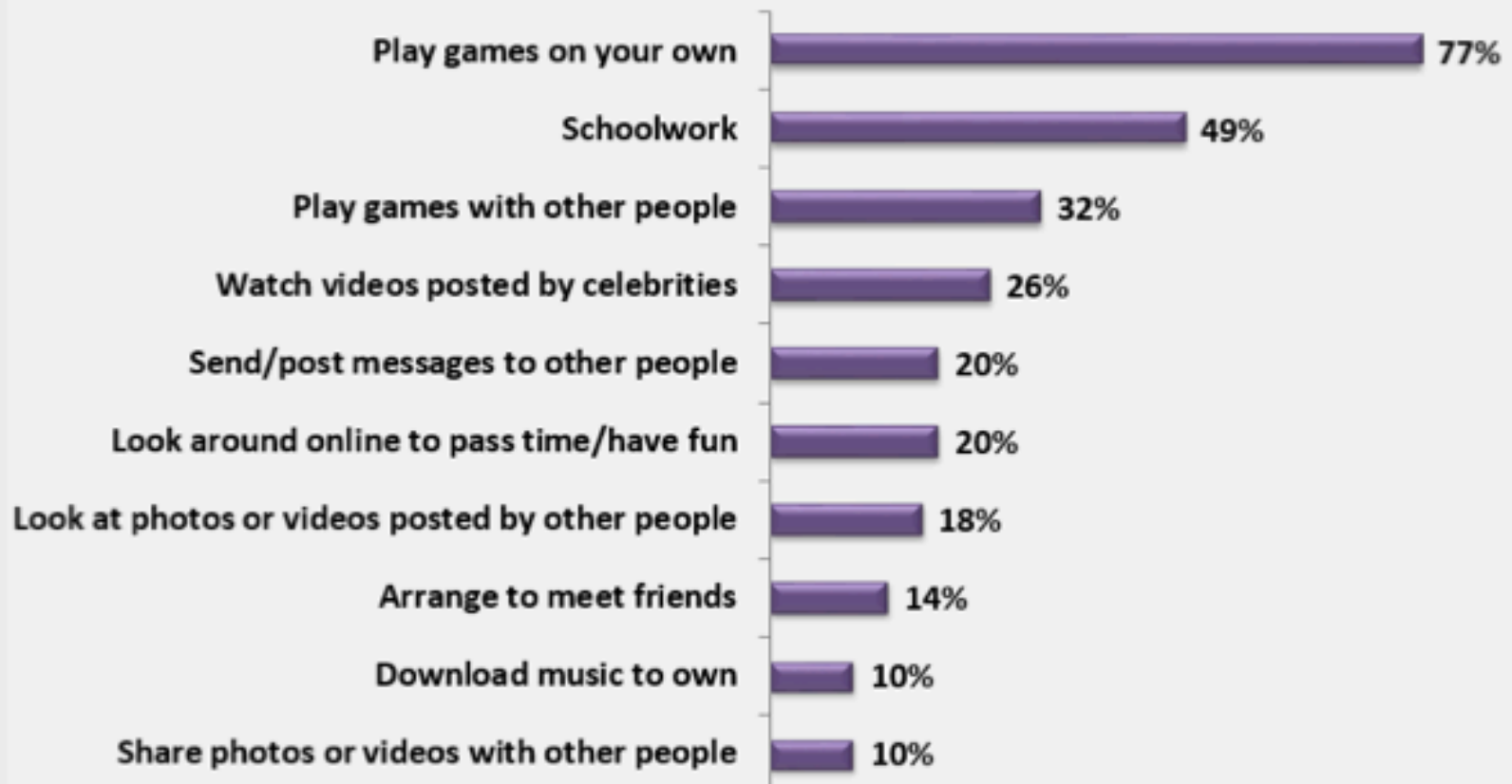

What Parents Think:



66% of parents of 8-11 year old children think that the benefits of the internet for their child outweigh any risks.



79% of parents of 8-11 year old children say that they trust their child to use the internet safely.



31% are concerned that their child may be giving out personal details online to inappropriate people.



27% of parents are concerned about the content of websites that their child visits.

- Add privacy settings or restrictions to all your devices at home.

SafeSearch and Parental Controls: What do they do?

-  **Age limits** can be set so that children can only see content appropriate to their age.
-  Timings can be set to limit **how long** children stay online and **when** they go online.
-  Specific programs can be **allowed or blocked**, like instant messenger services, or hardware, like webcams.
-  Some systems will send **alerts** when something happens.
-  SafeSearch helps keep adult content out of **search results** by screening websites that contain sexually-explicit content and removing them from the search results.



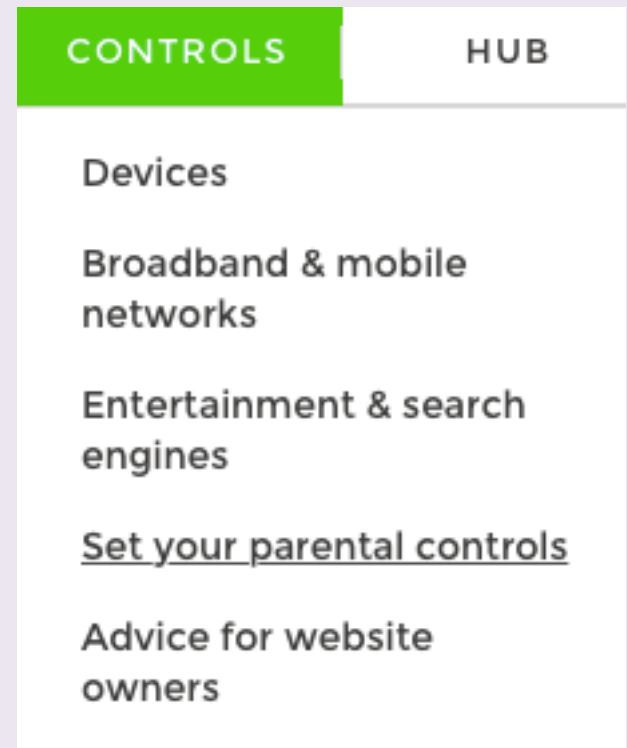
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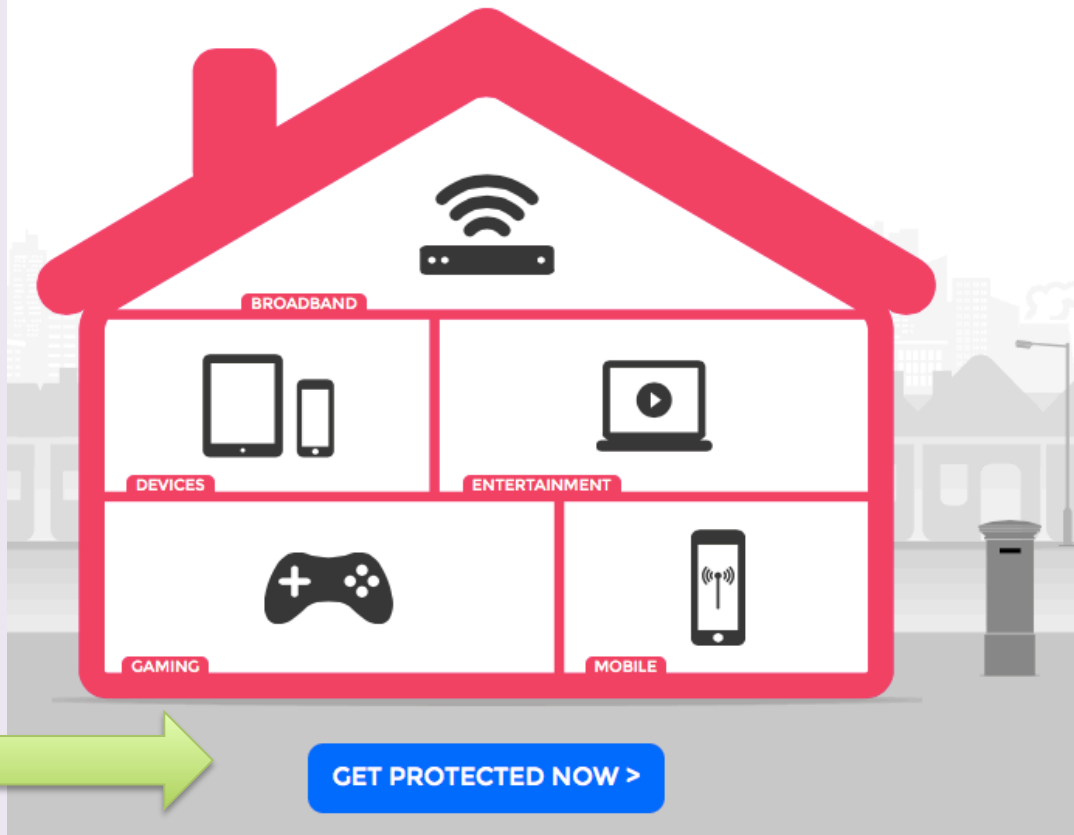

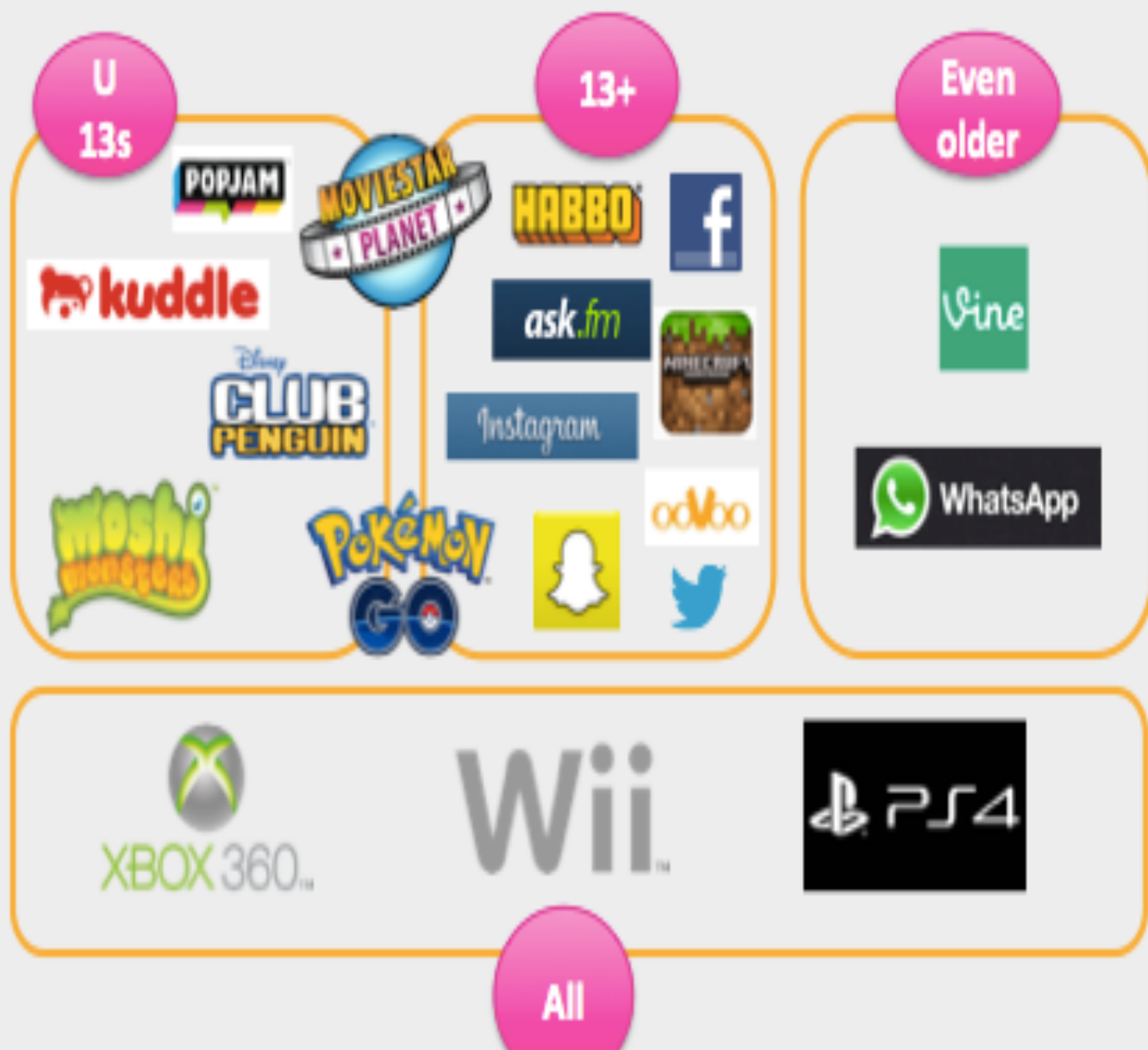
