#### Welcome

Hello and welcome to all of our new Year 6 children and parents. We are excited about getting to know the children better and supporting them to make great progress in this very important year in their education.

We kick-start Year 6 with our Autumn term topic called 'Lest we forget' where we will find out about World War Two.

#### Our Topic

Our topic has a history focus and some of the things we will be looking at include The Blitz; evacuation; propaganda; and daily life. This topic also links to a lot of our work in English, when we read good quality texts set during World War 2.

Some key questions we will be considering are:

- When was World War 2 and what were the main events?
- What was daily life like during the war?
- What was the experience of living during World War 2 and being evacuated?
- How did people try to keep safe during the Blitz?
- What are the different viewpoints of World War 2?
- What is propaganda and what was its importance during World War 2?
- What comparisons can be made between World War 2 and other key historical events?
- What was Britain's role during World War 2 and what impact did it have on world history?

We will be learning in an exciting, cross-curricular way in the autumn, meaning lots of subjects will be combined and taught in creative ways, producing wonderful outcomes and promoting a real enthusiasm for the topic.

On Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September, we will have our topic **Launch Day** and we would like the children to dress in 'evacuee' outfits (see picture on right). We would also like the children to bring in a suitcase, in which they have packed items they would like to take with them when evacuated. Throughout that day, we will be doing fun and exciting activities to launch our topic.

### Things to Remember

Home Learning: In Year 6, the children are expected to do more homework than previously, to help prepare them for secondary school.
