It was incredibly warming to see Marcus, at only 22 years of age, speaking so eloquently and openly about his own experiences, and being the voice for so many vulnerable families, holding our government to account. Black Lives Matter

Windrush Day 2020 falls on Monday 22nd June and is a day to honour the British Caribbean community, and the half a million people who travelled to the UK to help rebuild it after World War II. *Empire Windrush* arrived at the Port of Tilbury, near London, on 22 June 1948. There were 1,027 people on board and the passengers faced huge challenges from the moment the ship docked; despite responding to job adverts that suggested they would be welcome in the "mother country", the reception was very different. One passenger, Mr John Richards, reflected on the reality he was confronted with during an interview with the BBC in 1998, "They tell you it is the 'mother country', you're all welcome, you're all British. When you come here you realise you're a foreigner and that's all there is to it."

The arrival of the Empire Windrush 72 years ago marked a seminal moment in Britain's history; those who arrived on the Empire Windrush, their descendants and those who followed them, have made and continue to make an enormous contribution to rebuilding the country and public services following World War II, as well as enriching our shared social, economic, cultural and religious life.

This year, there are a number of ways that you can be part of celebrating Windrush Day. There will be a live poetry event during the evening celebrating the Windrush Generation. The Black Culture Archives will be performing live poetry on their Instagram page from 7-8pm, in partnership with youth charity Poetic Unity. BCA is the only national heritage centre dedicated to collecting, preserving and celebrating the histories of African and Caribbean people in Britain.

Lambeth residents will be taking part in a sing-along to Desmond Dekker's song, "You can get it if you really want", on their doorsteps on Windrush day to create a moment of unity and celebration for the Windrush Generation. We shall also be playing the song at 10:27 in recognition of the 1,027 people who arrived first in June 1948.





The Mirror Challenge

Here are some highlights sent in from this week...


Matilda wrote a fantastic poem and wanted to share it. We **LOVE** it, Matilda!

Google Classroom

If for any reason when you log in to Google Classroom and the screen is blank, please do not worry. Follow these simple steps:

- I. Click on the + symbol on the top left (it says join your first class)
- 2. Enter the class code (now shown below with the login details) and click join

You will now be back in the Year Group Classroom. Please ensure you monitor your children when using Google Classroom, making sure they do not change any settings.
