
RECEPTION





We really enjoyed painting our portraits in Reception. Can you guess who we are?





YEAR 1



In Year I, we have been designing and making a spaceship for Beegu using mixed media. We drew our designs and then wrote down a list of resources we would need to make them. Finally, we made our spaceships.





YEAR 2

In Year 2 we have been very busy in our Geography lessons. We made islands from Modroc adding features including the ocean, volcanoes and caves.

We have also continued making herbal remedies using ginger, lemongrass, aloe vera and okra in the same way as Mary Seacole.







YEAR 3



In Year 3 we have been learning about Sikhism. Following the Sikh belief in the selfless act of serving others (serva), we made bread to give to our families. We had to make sure we kneaded the bread well to help the dough rise.



YEAR 4







This week year 4 have been putting their coding skills to the test! We used Scratch to code our own educational games.

YEAR 5







In the final week of our topic 'River Deep, Mountain High', we looked at how people use rivers and made posters about the different uses e.g. for leisure, for transport, for energy, for food, for survival. Finally, we found out what causes flooding and then we all had great fun building our own rafts to survive a flood!

YEAR 6





We have been investigating how white light is made up of the 7 colours of the spectrum. This was first discovered by Isaac Newton.

We used our homemade spectroscopes to investigate how complex colours are produced from the 3 primary colours of light; red, green and blue.



COVID REMINDERS

SENSIBLE QUEUING



Please remember not to arrive at school too early in the morning and start queuing on the street before it is necessary. The gate opens at 8:30am and most mornings the bulk of the queue is through the gate by 8:35am. It really is not necessary to arrive at school until 8:30am, so please don't come to school before this. Some children are currently queuing for half an hour every morning and this just isn't necessary.



DROPPING CHILDREN OFF SAFELY

Please do not drop the children off outside the school gates and leave them to walk into school on their own. This is not safe. All children must be walked to their classroom by their parent/carer. If you drive to school, you must park and walk with your child. Only Year 6 children with permission from the Head Teacher may walk on their own.



FACE COVERINGS



ALL adults must wear a face covering at drop off and pick up (unless medically exempt). Wearing a face covering protects other people you come into contact with. Please help prevent the spread of Covid-19:

- Wear a face covering when queuing outside the school gate and when walking through the playground.
 - Keep 2m apart from other families at all times



PLEASE BE RESPECTFUL

There are a number of people who arrive at school and think it's acceptable to walk right to the front of the queue and push in! This is incredibly disrespectful to the other adults who wait patiently to come into school. If you are doing this, please stop. Have respect for others!
