Nursery are getting ready for Christmas with song rehearsals and making decorations. We also built this amazing castle.




RECEPTION

YEAR 4


In our RE lesson this week, we learned about the story of the Jewish festival Hanukkah. We also retold the story using a storyboard and played a game called Dreidel.

School Street



I'm sure most of you have seen that the council has completed part of the work to create the school street on Pragnell Road. The one-way system at the junction of Pragnell Road and Coopers Lane is now in place, so please take care to follow the new road layout.

The signs have been installed at the junction of Pragnell Road and Kingsand Road, which means that the restrictions advertised should be adhered to. The cameras are not yet operational, however there may well be parking enforcement officers monitoring the street.



The school will be using temporary barriers to close the road from January, while we wait for the cameras to be installed.
