The children have loved making and designing their own rockets in order to help Hannah get back home!


We have also loved exploring capacity and measurements in Maths this week.

YEAR 2











YEAR 5

Here is Bradley Leek's diagram of why we have night and day – fantastic detail, Bradley!


YEAR 6
