YEAR 2



YEAR 5

In history, Year 5 are learning about the British Empire. This week we learnt about the British occupation of India and the Battle of Plassy, which took place in 1759. We discussed our opinions of the British treatment of the people of India and felt they had been treated poorly. We then created placards calling for



fair treatment.

YEAR 6

This week in Year 6 we have been learning about how Britain changed after the war. We looked specifically at how the arrival of the Windrush was the start if a period of migration. Between 1948 and 1970 nearly half a million people left their homes in the Caribbean to live in Britain and became a vital part of British community and helped to rebuild after WW2. We learned that many people experienced racism during this time and how the Battle of Lewisham in 1977 was an example of how a community can come together to fight racism collectively. We have created Windrush artwork that will form a mural to celebrate the contribution of the Windrush generation in our local community. Windrush Day is the 22nd of June
