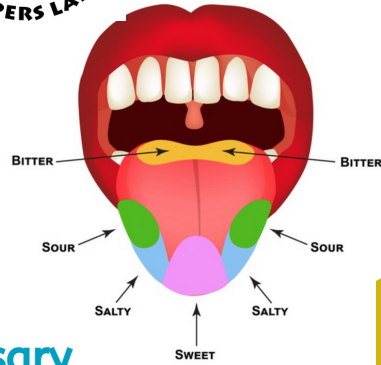




Some animals can't hear at all:

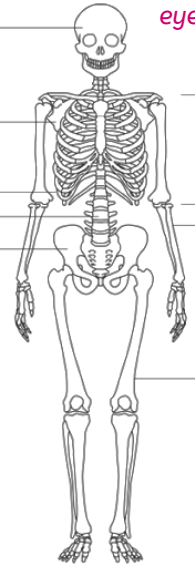

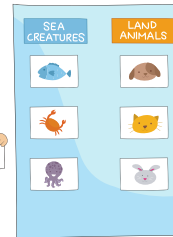
Rib cage

might not be!

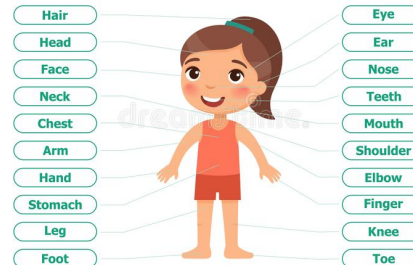
With your **EYES**,

Ear - the part of the body
