Acorn Book Club is a SE London based charity that takes donations of pre-loved books suitable for children aged between 3-11 years old and redistributes them to local primary schools so that they can be enjoyed again. The books are donated by members of the local community who can drop them off at any High Street branch of Acorn, John Payne or Langford Russell estate agents. The charity collects, sorts and then donates them to school libraries in need of a book refresh. 
