
#### **NURSERY**

Then on the same day it was Pancake day we celebrated this by putting lemon and sugar on our pancakes and eating them. We also had World Book Day where we dressed up as our favourite book character. We read 'We're Going to find the Monster' and had great fun making our own monsters using cardboard boxes.



#### RECEPTION

We have had a great week in Reception, looking at our World Book Day focus book, 'We're going to find the monster!' We have been making our own maps, leading to the monster, and have thought carefully about the different places we can travel through, such as forests, waterfalls and caves!





The children have been creating their own monsters this week, to go with our class book 'We're going to find the monster' and describing them using noun phrases and even alliteration!

#### YEAR 2

In Year 2, we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and understanding their properties. #### YEAR 3

Year 3 along with the rest of the school have enjoyed a wonderful world book day. We had some amazing costumes ranging from familiar stories such as 'Dog Man' to the wonderful pioneering Rosa Parks. The children loved all the work linked to our class book 'Look Up' including writing fact files about Mae Jemison and Guion Bluford. Don't forget to ask them to share their facts and test their knowledge!

#### YEAR 5

In science this week, Year 5 have continued our work on 'Forces'. This week we learnt about friction and tested which materials created the most friction. We rolled a toy car down these different surfaces; bubble wrap; fabric; paper; tin foil; cling film; and J-cloth. Our conclusion was that a rough surface creates more friction, which explain why people can travel so fast when they are skiing on snow, which is a smooth surface.



We also enjoyed dressing up for World Book day and loved listening to the visiting storyteller! We watched Dapo Adeola creating some of his wonderful illustrations and also created our own bookmarks, using the help of Draw with Rob.





#### YEAR 6

This week year six have been working on volume in Maths. We enjoyed using cubes to make different shapes and to help us identify the formula for finding the volume of a cuboid. We have also been looking at the idea of 'food miles' in our Geography lessons. We learnt about how reducing our food miles can be good for the environment as well as the negative effects of doing this. We loved looking at food packaging from around the world and calculating how far it had traveled using an online calculator!
