Where a child's learning & development does not yet meet what is expected at the end of the EYFS, then they are said to be emerging. The EYFS team work closely with Year 1 to ensure a smooth transition for all of our children.

In School we learn...

Physical Development (PD)

Children will be able to hold and use a pencil effectively and with independence. They will begin to show accuracy and care with drawing. Children will move energetically, . sunning hopping, skipping and climbing. They will negotiate spaces and obstacles safely, with consideration for themselves and others

Maths

<u>Children will have a deep</u> understanding of number to 10, including their composition. They will also be able to subitise numbers to 10. Children will automatically recall number bonds to 5 and some number bonds to 10, including double facts. They will verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system and compare guantities up to 10 in different contexts.

Understanding the World Children will know some

similarities and differences between things in the past and now. They will understand the past through settings, characters and events from books read in class and storvtelling. Children will describe their local environment using knowledge from observations, discussion, books & maps. They will talk about the differences between religious and cultural communities.
