Let's Learn Together

Go on a plant hunt on a local walk or visit Kew Gardens. How many plants and flowers can you name?

Geography

Children will look at the different regions of the UK. They'll recap England, Wales, Scotland & Northern Ireland. They'll look at the geographical differences, identify cultural symbols & differences, & famous people. They'll look again at weather, keep track of day-to-day atmospheric conditions to discuss, and link to latitude.

Music

Children will develop a sense of steady beat using their own bodies. They'll respond to music with a steady beat and play rhythm patterns on body percussion and instruments. They'll also look at simple notation, creating mini-beast inspired music using both voices and instruments.

Children will consolidate

Science

Children will use the local environment to observe how different plants grow. They will investigate what conditions are needed for plants to stay healthy, grow and reproduce. They will grow plants in different conditions including without light, without soil and without water.

Art

Children will study the work of Vincent Van Gogh. They will learn to make tints of colours by adding white, tones of colours by adding black, and mix their own secondary colours. They will create their own Van Gogh inspired artwork using these skills.

RE

Children will continue to learn more about three major world religions: Christianity, Hinduism and Sikhism. They'll explore the importance of sharing food and how that is celebrated in different ways.

PSHE

Children will learn more about what their bodies need to stay healthy including food and drink, exercise and plenty of sleep. They'll also look at different ways to learn and play instead of being on screens, as well as the benefits of sunshine and fresh air.

6 CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION

Music

Children will learn to move and play to a steady beat and to sound sequences. They will learn to control changing tempos through a range of songs. They will also listen to orchestral music and improvise their own descriptive pieces.

Children will get to design

vehicles. They will learn the best
way to join materials together, design
what the outside of their vehicle will look
like, build their technical knowledge and
evaluate and improve their

construction.

Visit some famous sites from

Children will learn about The Five
Pillars of Islam and the importance
of the Mosque. They will be
thinking about how Muslims
express their beliefs and what
worship means to them.

PSHE

Children will focus on naming, recognising and describing a range of feelings. They will look at ways to manage big feelings and the importance of telling someone you trust how you feel. Through discussion they will look at how feelings can affect peoples bodies and behaviour.

Children will become zoologists and collect data about bugs! They will explore sorting and classifying data using tick charts and tally charts, before representing their data using pictograms and other basic charts.
