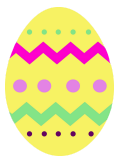


HAPPY EASTER

Each year the PTA organises fundraising events and activities to support the school. **This year we've been asked to raise £20,000 for the new Library.**

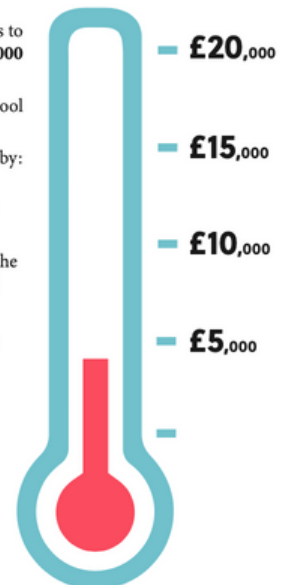
Can you help us fund this amazing new resource for the school and its children?

We also spent our dojo dollars and had hot chocolate. We danced the day away to the 'Easter freeze' song. Happy Easter everyone.



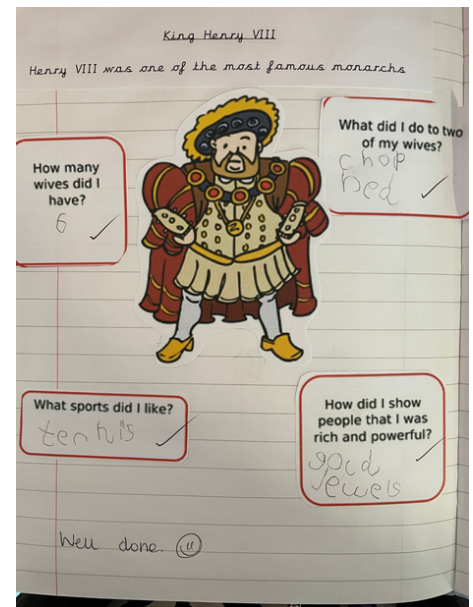
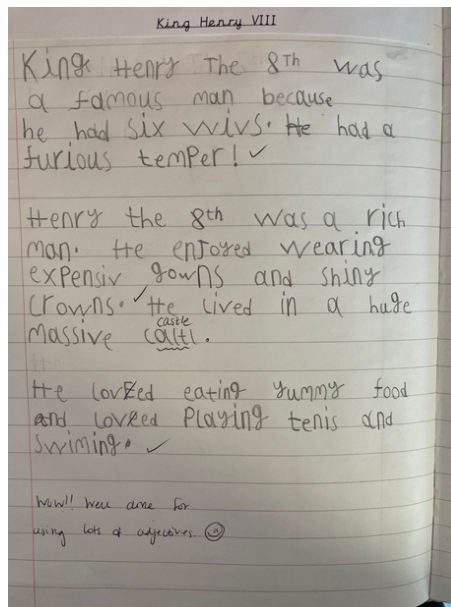
RECEPTION

YEAR 3

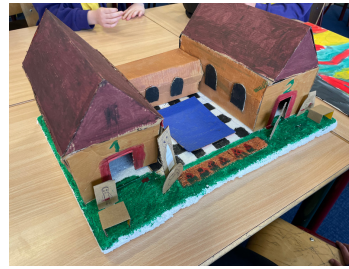
