# YEAR 1

Year 1 went on their first ever school trip this week and they were very excited!

Year 2 have been scientists, investigating what a plant needs to survive and how water travels through a plant. We are carrying out an investigation with celery and food colouring. We have made predictions and cannot wait to see our results on Monday! In Geography, we have been learning about English culture, including traditional food and famous landmarks.



#### YEAR 3

In Geography this week we looked in our atlases at mountain ranges in Asia and then named them. We have also been enjoying our new class book in Destination Reader called 'Rosie Revere the Engineer'.

She has made some amazing inventions from recycled materials. Lastly, Year 3 heard amazing tunes from the piano room which turned out to be Maria, our up and coming pianist!





# YEAR 4


In Year 4, we have been investigating our impact on the environment. We learned so many new things about single use plastics and came up with ideas on how to avoid using them. Single use plastics make up a lot of the rubbish we create. These plastics take many YEARS to decompose. Did you know that the equivalent of a truck load of rubbish is emptied into our oceans every minute? Have a look at the posters we made to create more awareness.



#### YEAR 5

In Year 5, we have been learning how to become super story-tellers. We have thought carefully about how we can keep our audience entertained and how to use adjectives, alliteration and repetition effectively. This week, we created story circles and took it in turns to retell the gruesome tale of Beowulf and Grendel.





#### YEAR 6

In our topic lesson this week, Year 6 learnt all about a place called 'Tornado Alley' in the USA. We discovered that Tornado Alley has up to 500 tornados a year due to the cool air from the Rocky Mountains colliding with the warm air from the Gulf of Mexico. We conducted an experiment to help us prove that warm air rises above cold air and we even recreated a tornado drill after hearing the warning siren! We then wrote some fantastic newspaper reports giving information about the destruction caused by an imaginary tornado in Kansas.
