YEAR 1

We have had a fantastic week in Year 1; exploring, learning, playing with our friends and even becoming cartographers!
Working together as a team, we had to follow a map with clues.
We were given directions such as forwards, backwards, to the left and to the right. Using our awareness of our environment, we successfully found the treasure.







YEAR 2

Year 2 have continued to work hard in maths by using different representations to make numbers up to 100. We have explored using dienes, numicon, straw bundles and ten frames. In English, we have been reading The Highway Rat. On Friday, we were tasked with finding the Highway Rat and followed clues until we found him! He made us walk around the whole school, as he kept escaping from us



YEAR 3

This week in Year 3 we had our launch day linked to our topic The Prehistoric World.

We looked at the various house formations during the stone age, then went on to make a diarama in the style of a stone age home. In the afternoon we looked at the various foods that were available during this period, we then tried blackberries, porridge, nettle tea and various herbs! Everyone had a great growth mindset when trying some foods they had not eaten before!



YEAR 4

This week Year 4 have started to discuss previous kings and queens. We looked at King James I and what kind of monarch he was. Through looking at sources, we discovered that he was incredibly power hungry and didn't want the Government to have more control than him. We then role played conversations between King James I and the Parliament - some of us really got into character!



YEAR 5

Inspired by Malala, Year 5 wrote persuasive speeches about how we could make the world a better place. As a year group we then read them at our own United Nations conference. In English this week, we started exploring our new book called Flotsam and we created underwater scenes and thought about how excited we would be if we discovered flotsam.

For our River Deep, Mountains High geography topic we learned how different mountains were formed and carried out a range of fun activities. Our work is truly beautiful and we are really proud.







Year 6 had a wonderful WW2 launch day this week! We made name tags to wear while we were being evacuated, then we did some role play to help us to imagine what it was like leaving our families and being chosen by new people to stay with. We also completed the 'Great Air Raid Shelter Challenge' in which we worked in teams to design air raid shelters which would protect an egg; we had great fun testing them! Finally we made 'no bake chocolate cake' using ingredients that were rationed during the war.
