
ATTENDANCE

YEAR 2

Year 2 enjoyed celebrating the launch of their new topic, Africa, last Friday by dressing up as different animals or in traditional African print and some children were safari rangers. We had a fun-packed day including experiencing a plane journey through Africa, tasting various fruit grown in different African countries and looking at a traditional home built by the Maasai tribe. In the afternoon, we created a beautiful silhouette picture by painting a sunset background and then drawing and cutting out different African animals from black paper.



YEAR 3

On Monday this week we had our Launch Day for The Ancient Greece topic. We created our own Parthenon, tasted food from Ancient Greece, designed our own Olympic game and ordered the key events of Ancient Greece. All the children showed amazing perseverance during the food tasting, where they were experiencing new tastes of some unusual foods in comparison to their everyday food choices!





YEAR 4

This week, we have been polishing our illustrating skills. We have identified different brush strokes and techniques, which were laid out in a video by Ed Vere. We then put our new skills to the test and drew an illustration of Leonard. This lion is the main character in our book, 'How to be a Lion'. We are thoroughly enjoying it and cannot wait to show you what we do next!



YEAR 5

In computing we are learning to be 'game developers'. We worked with our learning partners and thought of our own idea of a game. We had to think about what the background would be, how we would control our main sprite and how we score points and lose them. In PSHE we have been learning about basic first aid. This week we learned what to do if someone is choking or having an asthma attack. We then acted out our own scenarios showing what we should do to help. We decided that whatever first aid is required we must remain calm and be reassuring.







Our new topic is all about the Industrial Revolution. We started to learn about the largest social and demographic changes that took place in England during the 1800s by creating pictographs to show how many people began moving to cities such as Liverpool, Manchester, Leeds and Sheffield to work in factories. We considered how, as the cities expanded, the landscape changed and many factories, canals, bridges and aqueducts were constructed to meet the demands of making and transporting goods. This inspired us to complete some art work of scenes of an industrialised town during this time. We used a pencil to lightly sketch the pictures, then completed the detail using charcoal to create light and shade. We are very proud of our finished results which we have displayed in our classrooms.
