
Wednesday 1st February, Thursday 2nd March, Wednesday 15th March, Thursday 16th March

RECEPTION

This week in Reception we have been continuing with our topic "people who help us." We have been looking at dentists and the children have pretended to be dentists. In our home corner we have a garage and the children have been very helpful trying to fix the cars with our tools such as drills and hammers.



YEAR 1

We became actors this week and immersed ourselves in the role of Rapunzel! We used hot seating to ask questions to 'Rapunzel' and had to answer them whilst in role, imagining we were trapped in a tower.

Did you know Coopers Lane has its own tower? We had the opportunity to go up there in small groups this week, to give us a sense of how Rapunzel might be feeling. It really helped us with our acting!





YEAR 2

In RE, Year 2 have been learning about the 10 Commandments. We tried to order them based on importance and also thought about what our own 'golden rule' would be. In English, we have been basing our writing around

The Lion King. We created a conscience alley and tried to persuade Simba to either enter or not enter the elephant graveyard; in order to do this, we used powerful adjectives. In maths, we used our ten frames and counters to find the missing number in calculations.



YEAR 3

In Year 3 in Art this week, we were looking at proportions of the body and tried to create a person in proportion using plasticine. It was so much fun and we are all very proud of our models.















In Year 4 we spent quality time reading in our fabulous library this week. Covent garden enjoyed discovering lots of new titles and we shared them with our talk partners.



YEAR 5

This week we continued learning about space in science and found out how long it takes for all the planets to orbit the sun. Mercury only takes 88 days, which means some of us would be 44 years old if we lived there! In Computing, we began to create our games on scratch using the chrome books. We created all our assets and then started looking at the code we would need to write for our game. In English this week we received a mission message telling us that our new task was to sell Alex Rider's bike. First we became experts and then we used our persuasive powers to write and record a radio advert. Here we are editing our work on whiteboards with each other before writing in our books.

















YEAR 6

This week we have been immersing ourselves in what life was like for children during the Industrial Revolution. We thought about what we learned about the different roles that children had and the experiences they might have had. We used the drama technique of hot seating to interview each other to gain a better understanding of some of the dangerous and exhausting work that children undertook and empathise with them.
