RECEPTION

This week in Reception we started reading the book, "The Missing Piece" for World Book Day. We spoke about the 5 senses and then smelt lots of different things like cinnamon, basil, lemon and coffee. We then described the smells.

As a class we made our own puzzle by designing our own puzzle piece, thinking about our favourite place and what it might smell like.





YEAR 1

Another busy week in Year 1 where we have been trying out our new Drawing Club. The children have had the opportunity to create and make their own monster. Here is Ruby experimenting with drawing different types of monster for her project. Meanwhile Shakib has been sorting through his 2d shapes to create a pattern on the interactive board. To cap off a busy week, in Maths the children have been looking at 2 digit numbers and making groups of 10.

YEAR 2

This week Year 2 have been learning about multiplication and division in maths. We have used pegboards to create arrays and explored the law of commutativity (e.g. 4 x 3 = 12 and 3 x 4 = 12). In geography, we have used directional language and compass directions to visit different locations on a map of Africa. In science, we've been thinking about how all matter can be organised into 'dead', 'living' or 'never alive' and explaining our choices; paper is 'dead' because it came from a tree which was alive!



YEAR 3

In Year 3, as part of our science lessons, we have been exploring parts of a plant. Our task this week was to dissect and label a flower. In Geography, we have been comparing the climate in Greece and the UK. The children became meteorologists and presented a weather report.





YEAR 4

We've had a great time being detectives in Year 4 this week!
Some strange things were happening around Coopers Lane; there were lily pads everywhere! It was up to us to find out what had been going on.

We started reading our new text, called 'Tuesday', which is all about mysterious floating frogs. We had the opportunity to create our very own news report to share our findings on these events.



YEAR 5

This week we continued to learn about forces in science. We learned about friction and then carried out an investigation to find out what material created the most friction. This was great fun and we enjoyed discussing our results and thinking about what makes a fair test. In Music this week, Wimbledon were composing melodies and making sure the beats in the bar added up to 4. They then played these on their glockenspiels, making sure to count the beat steadily to keep in time.



YEAR 6

Over the last week, Year 6 have started their new topic about economic activity in Britain. We have thought about the idea of trade, and investigated which products we import and export in the UK. We have also been looking at the idea of 'food miles' in our Geography lessons. We learnt about how reducing our food miles can be good for the environment, but we also considered the negative impacts of changing where we get our food from. We loved looking at food packaging from around the world and working out how far it had travelled using an online food miles calculator.


