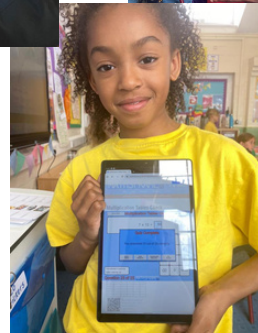
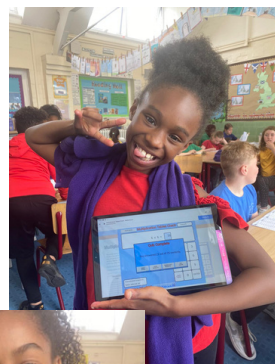

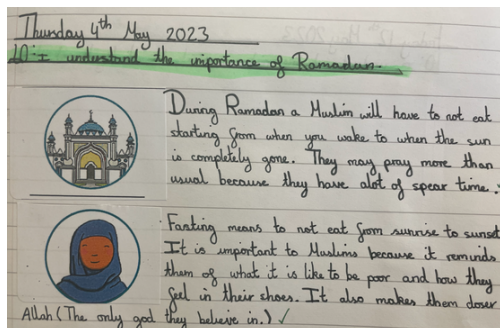




## YEAR 5
