






YEAR 1

Year One have had an amazing start back at school. We have been busy doing lots of fun phonics learning and phonics games in class. As part of Talking Time this week we learnt about the famous Dutch artist Piet Mondrian. We learnt about how Mondrian developed a style of his own art called neoplasticism. His work became minimalistic. He painted using simple lines, right angles and blocks of primary colours. We experimented painting in the style of Piet Mondrian and really enjoyed it!



This week we have been immersed in our learning about the Great Fire of London; we have looked at different artefacts and guessed what the items might have been used for. We have travelled back to 1666 and written a postcard back to ourselves in 2023, we have started reading a book called 'Toby and the Great Fire of London' and we have made Tudor-style houses. In maths, we have been learning about mass and used balance scales to compare the mass of objects.










YEAR 5
