# HOW TO SPOT FAKE NEWS

The news you see online or on social media isn't always going to be accurate. And it can be hard to tell what's real and what's fake.

Some websites will report fake news or things that aren't completely true. They might do it because they want to scare you or make you do something. Or because they make money from people going to their site.

Fake news can look real, but there are ways to help you spot it.

### · Check the source

Check the name of the website and its web address to see if it looks real. Some sites will try to look like other websites so you think they're genuine.

### • Look for evidence

Find out whether it's being reported on other sites that you know and trust. If it's only being reported on websites you've never heard of then it might not be true.

### Don't decide straight away

Sometimes headlines or stories are designed to scare or interest you. Read what's in the article carefully, ask yourself whether it seems true and why they're saying it.

### • Ask someone you trust

Try asking an adult you trust to see what they think. If you're worried about something you've seen online, you can always talk to a Childline counsellor.

# YEAR 1

Year 1 have had a wonderful week! We have been busy learning the names of our oceans and continents. There is a very catchy song that we have learnt to help us learn themask your child if they can sing it to you! In Drawing club this week, we read 'Dinosaur Department store', we were then challenged to create our own Dinosaur department store in provision, in our block area. We learnt that some dinosaurs are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores and have really loved using different materials to create our own dinosaurs, too.

We ended the week with our first stay and read session with our parents this morning, and it was a huge success! The next one will be in two weeks' time.















Year 2 have all been superheroes this week and we've written about a rescue mission to save our poor class penguin, who has been captured by a wicked villain! We have thought about all the different superpowers we can have including fire power, ice power and invisibility! In geography, we've continued learning about maps and identifying the continents and oceans. In PE we have been practising balances using different parts of our bodies.

# YEAR 3

This week, we immersed ourselves in a cave setting to understand what it feels like to be Dave, who lives in a cave. We visited the forest school area and saw a fire, cave paintings and lots more cave items. We then got underneath the tables in the classroom and pretended this was our own cave, where we completed cave paintings.







In Year 4 this week, we have been reading the book
'Every Every Child a Song' which is all about the rights of children. We have learnt all about the different rights that we are entitled to and we have celebrated the things which make us different! We designed our own birds, which are a symbol of freedom, with words that describe us.



This week Year 5 have conducted exciting experiments in science. As part of our 'Properties and Changes of Materials' topic we have been investigating different materials and their uses. We started this week's lesson with a football, basketball, tennis ball, volleyball and sponge ball and tested out which of them was the bounciest. Then, we had a range of materials including tin foil, bubble wrap, paper and tissue and wanted to find out which was the best material for absorbing water.











Year 6 had a wonderful WW2 launch day this week! We made name tags to wear while we were being evacuated, then we did some role play to help us to imagine what it was like leaving our families and being chosen by new people to stay with. We also completed the 'Great Air Raid Shelter Challenge' in which we worked in teams to design air raid shelters which would protect an egg; we had great fun testing them! Finally we made 'no bake chocolate cake' using ingredients that were rationed during the war
