You can find a link to the UN Convention of the Rights of a Child on the school website and it would be great if you could spend some time looking into the rights together.














# We are continuing to use our values based behaviour management system across the school.

It reinforces the school's values.









Each value has been assigned a 'dojo monster' as below:



- A 'dojo point' will be awarded to the class when a child clearly demonstrates one of the values.
- The class is given a 'Dojo Dollar' every time they make it to a multiple of 10 points in a given week.
- Once awarded, Dojo Dollars are stored in a class jar and are used to buy whole class rewards from a shopping list.



- The class totals are cleared at the end of each week
- Lunch time staff will give out dojo dollars at lunch times.
- Two children will be given a 'VIP (Values in Practice) Award' in assembly on Friday for demonstrating the values and will be able to place their picture on display in the hall for that week.

The system is consistent across the school and we would appreciate it if you would continue to reinforce these values at home so that the children are fully aware of how to show them on a daily basis.

# Our Year 1 Classroom News

#### Autumn Term Information

#### Welcome message

Hello and welcome to all of our new Year I children and parents & carers. We are really looking forward to meeting and getting to know all of you in September.

We have many mini topics that we'll look at throughout the term, with each one lasting a week, sometimes two.

Our fantastic continuous provision supports the children with the transition from Reception to Year I and we have lots of fun activities planned!

#### **English and Maths**

In English we will be joining Drawing Club! Who doesn't want to be part of a club? We will read a variety of picture books and look at their characters, settings and then we will go on an adventure out of the stories using our imagination.. We always start by drawing a picture, and then we write about it. The focus is building on sentence structure.

In Maths we will build upon prior knowledge of place value within 10 to include counting on and back, fewer and more than. We will also look at addition and subtraction, number bonds, fact families and the part-whole model up to 10.

#### Things to remember

Reading: Please ensure book bags are brought to school daily, as books will be changed when children read with a class adult. One new book will be issued for the week to develop fluency and increase comprehension. We really appreciate help, from an adult or older sibling at home, listening, reading and sharing books with your children daily. All children will visit the Library each **Thursday** morning. They will bring one book home to be returned the following week, unless they haven't finished it. **Homework**: In Year I, there will be weekly homework. This will be spellings and maths. Spellings will be based on sounds and tricky words they learn each week. They will be also be given a Numbots log in to practise maths each day for 5 minutes.





Make a comment about how your child got on with the book.



- If their book has not been returned, your child will not be able to take out a new book.






<u>Recap:</u>



- Phonics will take place everyday at school.
- Your child will read with an adult 1:1 once per week.
- Reading books will be changed every week.
- Please ensure the reading book and record are in your child's bag everyday.
- It would be greatly appreciated if you could add an entry in the reading record every time you read with your child.
- Spellings will be sent home on a Friday, for children to be quizzed the following Friday.



- We have invested in an engaging online tool for Maths called Numbots.
- It works on all devices so can be used in school and at home.
- It uses games as a way to practise skills.
- All the games are automatically tailored to the individual child's needs.
- Logins are in the front cover of Reading Record.



#### **Online safety at home**

## PE & Forest School




PE will take place on Friday, every week, throughout the Autumn Term.


## You can...
