On your child's forest school day, we would like the children to come to school dressed in old clothes, as they might get a bit muddy. All clothing should be clearly named. - A spare pair of clothes or uniform if the weather is wet.
- Hat, scarves and gloves (in colder weather)

YEAR 1


This week we learnt all about Africa. During Talking Time, we explored Africa as a continent, it's climate and animals. We learnt about Kente cloth - one of the most recognisable textiles in Africa and is from Ghana. Different colours are used when weaving the cloth to symbolise different things and feelings. For example, blue symbolises love, fortune, peace and harmony. We had an absolutely wonderful time creating our own Kente cloth pieces using the technique of weaving. We then

decorated them to complete our piece.











YEAR 2

We had great fun dressing up for We Scare Hunger on Tuesday. Year 2 were busy in their half terms creating maps of their homes and bedrooms to end their Marvellous Maps unit in geography. YEAR 5

First we explored the chronology of Ancient Egypt in relation to other periods of history. Next, we learnt how to mummify a body and even mummified our own tomatoes, which we will come back to in 40 days. Finally, we took on the pyramid challenge, working in pairs to build an Ancient Egyptian pyramid. We had so much fun and are super excited to learn more!
