This week Year Six have been learning about concentration camps during WW2. We have been looking at the book 'Rose Blanche' and we enjoyed using drama to explore some of the characters. We created freeze frames and then 'hot seated' some of the characters to investigate their thoughts and feelings at a key moment in the story.
